# SSA Scholarship recipients

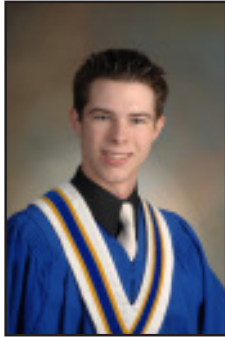
We received confirmation from the Ministry of Education that six of our MEI students who graduated last year are the recipients of a Secondary School Apprenticeship Scholarship.

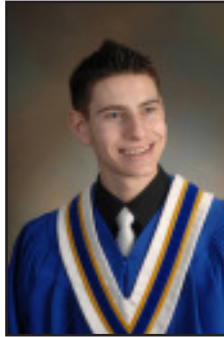
